Chief Cooper spoke to the following:

- Calls for service have increase by 5000 calls. Half of the calls involve non-criminal events, suspicious persons etc.;
- Investigations are underway involving three bear spray incidents;
- Investigation involving the Dawn Walker incident;
- Agreement between SPS and University of Regina to assist with social work practicum placement;
- Statistics Canada released its Crime Severity Index (CSI) which evaluates the way crime effects a community. Saskatoon is ranked 6 overall, the lowest since the index started in 1998;
- Attended the Canadian Association Chiefs of Police Conference (CACP) in Quebec City, Quebec. Four resolutions adopted at the 117th CACP Annual General Meeting on July 25, 2022 including the creation of a Canadian Centre for policing intimate partner violence and mandatory tracing of crime guns across Canada. The four resolutions can be viewed here; and
- Changes to school zone and playground speed limits. The speed limit of 30km/h will be in effect all year round, seven days a week from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
